

AIM

To motivate & empower participants to start actions in the YOUTH programme, to improve the quality of their projects by multiplying this experience and raising the awareness that a short distance international cooperation can hold longer, is powerful , practical and can lead to sustainable results.

OBJECTIVES

- Achieving the awareness that the main idea behind “cross border cooperation” does not end after 1th of January 2007, when it disappears from the Youth program.
- Raising the awareness that an international project does not always has to mean “far traveling”
- Stimulating long term cooperation
- to develop ideas for projects
- to discuss and discover the value of the youth program as an extra tool in the general approach of political and historical (mis-) understanding.

AIM:

The training course aims to support the professional development of young trainers/workers/students. We intend to raise the quality of projects concerning citizenship in general and we give a close focus on the European citizenship.

OBJECTIVES:

- To point out the connection between citizenship, responsibility for one's immediate environment and society and active participation
- To talk about historical and recent understandings of citizenship and its implications for participation
- To approach different levels of citizenship (local – national – international/European)
- To reflect on the notion of European identity and its underlying values (democracy, tolerance, plurality, human rights)
- Creating online toolbox

AIM:

The project facilitates a Europe-wide exchange of practices on how to create learning spaces for active European citizenship on behalf of young Europeans within non-formal education and youth-work. Partners and young NGO activists throughout Europe contribute with experiences from their communities thus functioning as Europe-Gateways.

OBJECTIVES:

- To produce a survey of methodology of learning for active European citizenship: What is active European citizenship competence, how to use non-formal education to promote learning in active European citizenship, and how to practically combine learning for active citizenship on both European level and on local level.
- To invite 65 young Europeans active in NGOs to Denmark in the summer 2005 to script concretely for the benefit of the wider European public how to create learning spaces for active European citizens with a clear local dimension.
- To promote results of the conclusions, it is crucial to disseminate results so that it influences other NGOs that have not been represented during the project itself. Thanks to dissemination methods we will be able to raise the quality of education in whole Europe.
- To invite European educators and civil society to give feedback: This during a web dialogue at the project website as well as during a final 2-day international conference under the headline "Learning for active citizenship in Europe of tomorrow".
- To create an "Online NGO-Bank of ideas" is created in conclusion of Youth2005 to promote innovative actions of participating NGOs.

AIM:

To promote mutual understanding between Polish and German youth by creating a common youth center in Gorlitz or Zgorzeles (two towns lying on the border)

OBJECTIVES:

- to arrange a youth club with 30 places for youngsters to spend their free time by September 1st
- to fight stereotypes
- to learn more about each other's culture and tradition
- to create and print a poster and a leaflet promoting the center in 300 copies each by July 1st
- to involve 15 young people from both Germany and Poland in the preparations between July 1st and September 1st

AIM:

To intensify cross border relation by providing cheap transport across the border between two main towns of the region

OBJECTIVES:

- to create a bus route between two neighbouring regions in order to recover common culture and history of both regions
- to schedule 5 buses daily going from town A to town B and back by July 1st
- to build 10 bus stops in 5 villages (village A, village B, village C, village D, village E) by June 1st
- to promote intercultural learning
- to get between 15 and 30% of finance from two cross border regional authorities

AIM:

To rise awareness about European identity among young people from Germany, Czech Republic, Romania, Greece and Slovakia through series of journalism workshops connected with this topic.

OBJECTIVES:

- to give young people a chance to get to know other cultures,
- to train skills on writing, editing, making interviews, radio and TV programmes
- to create a newspaper, radio feature, and tv spot connected with the topic of european identity
- to present the result of those workshops to the local community
- to plan follow up projects
