

## Method description

<b>Title:</b>	The house of neighbours
<b>Target group:</b>	Youth
<b>Issues addressed:</b>	Feedback and evaluation
<b>Aim/learning outcome:</b>	To continuously evaluate the training course
<b>Objectives:</b>	To receive feedback from participants on every day bases
<b>Duration:</b>	5 minutes a day
<b>Materials needed:</b>	- Pens, A5 papers, tape, big space on the wall (2 x 5 meters)
<b>Special skills or knowledge of the trainer needed:</b>	-
<b>Step by step instruction:</b>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Find space on the wall and during the integrating session let the participants draw themselves and write their name on A5 paper (you can as well use the Picasso portrait method). Then stick these portraits on the wall in height about 80 cm. Create one line from the portraits.</li> <li>2. After the last session of the first day hand out again A5 papers and pens and ask participants to reflect on the day. Ask them what their impression is. What was good/ bad, useful/not useful, etc). They have to answer your questions by drawing maximum of 3 symbols and writing maximum of 10 words on the paper. This paper symbols a brick. Metaphorically participants will build up a house together.</li> <li>3. When someone is done he can stick the paper above his drawing from the morning.</li> <li>4. Next day repeat the same process</li> <li>5. When the last day comes, repeat the process, but after that close the house with a roof made out of flipchart papers. Participants should decorate the roof by the overall impression.</li> </ol>
<b>Comments:</b>	The evaluation method gives basic feedback to the trainers. It is a fast graphical output of the day that helps as well participants to find similarities with others and be "in the picture". It creates as well a common product that helps the atmosphere in the group.
